

After many months of proposals, planning, and designing, the process of building a new fire station in Shingle Springs has begun.

The existing station was built by volunteer firefighters in 1962 and had served the community well until erosion and settling caused shifting of the foundation, damaging the structure. With the addition of the full time ambulance and increased staffing to serve a growing community it became necessary to build a new fire station. In 2007 voters approved funding for the reconstruction of Station 28 at 3860 Ponderosa Road.

The new station is designed to meet our current and future needs. MFB Architects of Sacramento, Carlton Engineering of Shingle Springs, and local contractor, D. G. Granade Inc. have teamed up to build a new Station 28 on the existing property which is expected to be completed early next year.

The new fire station will have a large room that public groups or clubs may reserve for meetings.

As always we urge the public to call 911 if they have an emergency, however, for routine business we want our citizens to know they will find our temporary Station 28 at **3970 Durock Road** (formerly known as Lazy Y Feed Store).
