- Initial plans are underway for the Annual Wildfire Safety Day scheduled for early May.
- Staff is working with the City to modify their business license process to include Fire Department life-safety inspections when appropriate.

JPA

- The RFP for the 9th Medic Unit has been submitted; our presentation is scheduled for March 3.
- The JPA held an insurance workshop for the transporting agencies on February 12. These discussions are follow-up items related to the Master Contract.

District Information

- The District recently completed our Engineer promotional testing process. Four members successfully completed the process and are now eligible for promotion.
- Our six (6) new members completed their training academy with a class run from DSP Station 49 to the Bell Tower on February 14. The new members were presented their helmets and witnessed the promotion of their lead instructor, Justin Bautista, to Captain. Captain Bautista is assigned to Engine 28 (B Shift).
- The PAO to Suppression program began on January 12. Four PAOs are transitioning to Firefighter/Paramedics and are on track to complete their capstone testing in March.
- We participated in the OES pre-positioning during the recent snowstorms. DSP Engine 644 was struck by a snowplow. No injuries were reported; however, the engine is currently out of service.
- Realignment of Chief Officers has been completed. Chief Daniels is now assigned to Division 7704.
- Staff has been working with a local artist who has proposed painting a Historic City of Placerville Fire Department themed mural on Station 25.

POLICY TITLE: Authorized Leave

POLICY NUMBER:2160

Effective Date: March 19, 2026

2160 LEAVE OF ABSENCE WITH PAY

2160.10

Family Death: A leave of absence can be requested for a death in the immediate family. Such leave shall not exceed 5 calendar days for 40-hour employees or 2 shifts for 56-hour employees. This will be charged to employee's sick leave.

2160.111

Immediate family: spouse, parents, siblings and children.

2160.20

Jury Duty: A leave of absence will be granted when employees are subpoenaed for jury duty. All fees received from jury duty, excluding reimbursement for expenses, shall be turned over to the District. Employees shall notify the District office upon receiving a subpoena for jury duty.

2160.30

Subpoena or Deposition Request: A leave of absence will be granted when employees are subpoenaed or requested to appear for a deposition relating to District business. Employees shall notify the District office upon receiving subpoena or request for deposition.

2160.40

Military Leave: District employees shall be entitled to temporary military leave of absence for certain Armed Forces duty with pay applied to annually required 30 consecutive days of summer camp training of employee and is not required to make up such days in order to receive his/her salary.

Employees of the Fire District who are members of any reserve component of the Armed Forces shall be granted leave from work, without pay, to attend monthly scheduled reserve training. When the employee's reserve duty day falls on his/her regular shift day, he may obtain a shift trade with another qualified employee or use a day of vacation or forfeit normal pay for that shift.

If the employee chooses to take a vacation day or forfeit pay for that shift, it will be the responsibility of the District to find a replacement for that shift, if possible.

There, still is no loss of benefits for leave absences granted with pay.

2160.60

The Chief may grant a temporary leave of absence without pay, for a period up to twelve (12) months, in the following instances:

Deleted: not to exceed 60 days

A. To attend classes or schools that will benefit the District.

B. In the case of a family emergency.

C. Special Request(s) from Employee(s)

2160.70

The Board of Directors may grant leave of absence for extended periods, beyond twelve (12) months. A written request must be sent to the Board secretary prior to the monthly Board meeting.

2160.80

Loss of benefits while on leaves of absence:

A. Accumulation of vacation and sick leave. (Accrued vacation and sick leave on record shall not be lost)

B. Contributions to health insurance. (Note: District will continue to pay benefits if reimbursed by the employee)

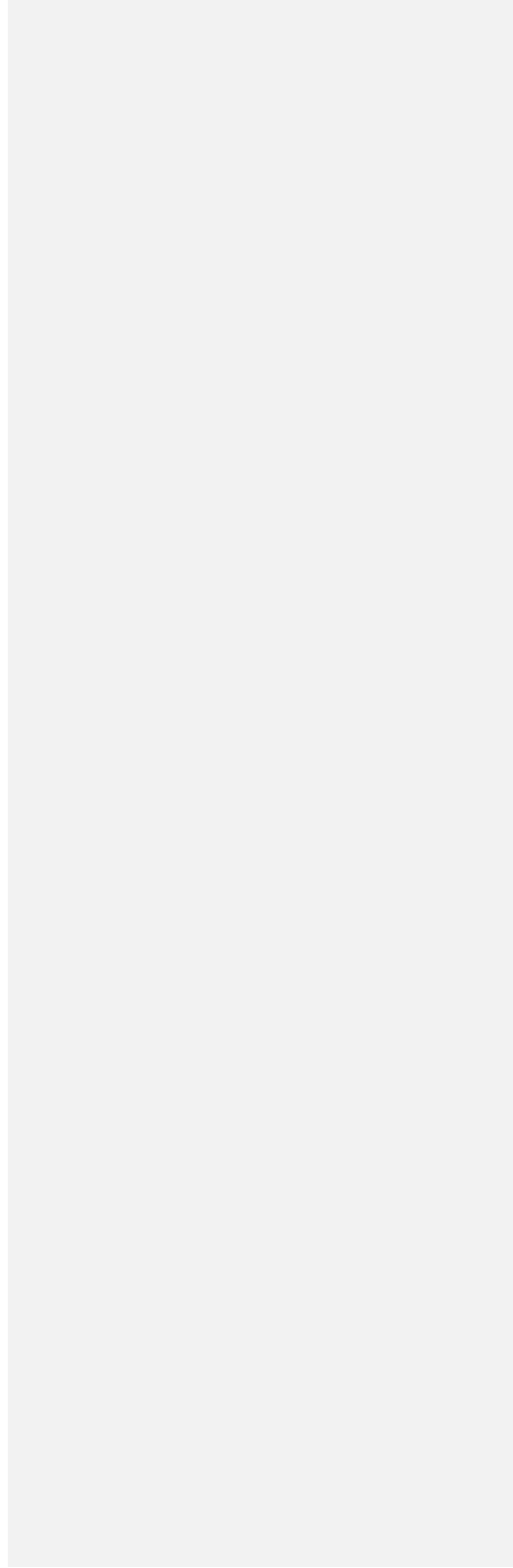

POLICY NUMBER: 3060

POLICY TITLE: Transferred Diamond Springs / El Dorado Fire Protection District Employees

ADOPTED: *February 19, 2026*

EFFECTIVE: Upon Completion of Annexation

3060.1 PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to formally establish and maintain an official record of employees transferred from the former Diamond Springs–El Dorado Fire Protection District (DSP) to the El Dorado County Fire Protection District as a result of annexation. This policy provides clarity, consistency, and transparency in identifying transferred employees for administrative, financial, contractual, and legal purposes.

3060.2 POLICY

The El Dorado County Fire Protection District shall maintain an official name list identifying all former Diamond Springs–El Dorado Fire Protection District employees who transferred to the District, whether currently active or retired.

This list shall serve as the authoritative reference for any resolution, agreement, policy, or official document that references or applies to **“Transferred Diamond Springs–El Dorado Fire Protection District Employees,”** whether **Current/Active** or **Retired**.

3060.3 DEFINITIONS

- **Current/Active Transfer Employees:**
Active employees of the former Diamond Springs–El Dorado Fire Protection District who became employees of the El Dorado County Fire Protection District as a result of annexation and who remain actively employed by the District.
 - **Retired/Transfer Employees:**
Former employees who retired from the Diamond Springs–El Dorado Fire Protection District and are now retirees of the El Dorado County Fire Protection District as a result of the annexation.

3060.5 ADMINISTRATION

The Fire Chief, or designee, shall be responsible for maintaining this policy and ensuring the accuracy of the transfer employee list. Updates may be made administratively to reflect status changes, provided the intent and integrity of the policy remain unchanged. This policy and the associated transfer employee list shall be reviewed annually on or around **January 1st** to ensure continued accuracy and compliance.

3060.6 AUTHORITY

This policy is adopted under the authority of the Board of Directors of the El Dorado County Fire Protection District.

Staff has been working with our insurance broker, Northern California Fire District Association – Atwood ISU, to complete the renewal process for insurance with JPRIMA. The district has received the proposal for renewal with JPRIMA for the timeframe of April 1, 2026, through April 1, 2027. The proposed renewal is for an annual cost of \$244,269.00.

For context, the district insurance premium for April 1, 2025, through April 1, 2026, was \$230,017.00. Staff is very appreciative of the work and advocacy of our broker to keep the annual increase to a minimum.

Northern California Fire Districts Association is aware of the pending annexation and is working on a combined policy for review.

Staff would recommend the Board of Directors approve the annual insurance renewal as presented by JPRIMA and authorize the Fire Chief to sign the renewal.

The most we will pay for loss or expense under this coverage is **\$5,000**.
- (9) Service Interruption** – Subject to more extensive provisions outlined in the policy, any insurance provided for loss of income, extra expense, data restoration or spoilage is extended to apply to your loss, damage, or expense caused by a failure or disruption of service.
- (10) Spoilage** – We will pay for physical damage to perishable goods due to spoilage; for physical damage to perishable goods due to contamination from the release of refrigerant; and/or any necessary expenses you incur to reduce the amount of loss under this coverage. Valuation and replacement conditions apply. The most we will pay for loss, damage or expense under this coverage is **\$100,000**.

Pollution Remediation Expenses: Pays up to \$25,000 (covered cause of loss) or \$100,000 (specified cause of loss) for remediation expenses incurred as a result of an actual, alleged, or threatened presence of pollution conditions at a premises described in the Declarations from a Covered Causes of Loss or Specified Cause of Loss occurring during the policy period and reported within 180 days. Covered Causes of Loss means risks of direct physical loss unless the loss is excluded or limited by the Property Coverage Form. Limits may be increased for a charge.

Specified Cause of Loss means the following: fire, lightning, windstorm or hail, explosion, riot or civil commotion, vehicles or aircraft, smoke, sonic boom, vandalism and malicious mischief, sprinkler leakage, sinkhole collapse, volcanic action, falling objects, weight of ice, snow or sleet, or water damage. Water damage means only accidental discharge or leakage of water or steam as the direct result of the breaking or cracking of any part of a system or appliance containing water or steam.

Property In Transit or Off Premises: Pays up to \$100,000 for direct physical loss or damage to covered property (real and personal property) while in transit or while temporarily off premises caused by a covered cause of loss, including your covered computer hardware while off premises.

SCADA Upgrades: Pays up to \$100,000 to upgrade your scheduled SCADA system after direct physical loss from a Covered Cause of Loss. The upgrade is in addition to its replacement cost. SCADA means the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition system used in water and wastewater treatment and distribution to monitor leaks, waterflow, water analysis, and other measurable items necessary to maintain operations.

Unintentional Errors: Pays up to \$250,000 for any unintentional error or omission you make in determining or reporting values or in describing the covered property or covered locations.

Personal Effects: Pays up to \$25,000 for direct physical loss or damage to personal effects owned by you, your officers, managers, elected or appointed officials, employees, or volunteer workers caused by a covered cause of loss at your premises. Will pay up to “replacement cost.”.

Lock Replacement: Pays up to \$25,000 for lock, lock cylinder, & key replacement after theft at covered premises or damage to a lock as a result of a covered cause of loss at a covered premises. No deductible applies.

Foundations: Your real property includes foundations located at a described premise.

KEY DEFINITIONS

Covered Equipment: Means covered real property and personal property that generates, transmits, or utilizes energy or which, during normal usage, operates under vacuum or pressure, other than the weight of its contents. Covered equipment may utilize conventional design and technology or new or newly commercialized design and technology.

None of the following is covered equipment: (a) structures, foundation, cabinet or compartment; (b) insulating or refractory material; (c) sewer piping, buried vessels or piping, piping forming or part of a sprinkler or fire suppression system; (d) water piping other than boiler feedwater piping, boiler condensate return piping or water piping form as part of a refrigerating or air conditioning system; (e) vehicle or any equipment mounted on a vehicle; (f) satellite, spacecraft or any equipment mounted on a satellite or spacecraft; (g) dragline, excavation, or construction equipment; (h) equipment manufactured by you for sale; or (h) electronic data.

Electronic Circuitry: Means microelectronic components, including but not limited to circuit boards, integrated circuits, computer chips, and disk drives.

Electronic Circuitry Impairment:

- (a) Means a fortuitous event involving electronic circuitry within covered equipment to suddenly lose its ability to function as it had been functioning immediately before such event. This definition is subject to the conditions specified in (b), (c), and (d) below.
- (b) We shall determine that the reasonable and appropriate remedy to restore such covered equipment's ability to function is the replacement of one or more electronic circuitry components of the covered equipment.
- (c) The covered equipment must be owned or leased by you or operated under your control.
- (d) None of the following is an electronic circuitry impairment:
 - (i) Any condition that can be reasonably remedied by:
 - 1) Normal maintenance, including but not limited to replacing expendable parts, recharging batteries or cleaning;
 - 2) Rebooting, reloading, or updating software or firmware; or
 - 3) Providing necessary power or supply.
 - (ii) Any condition caused by or related to:
 - 1) Incompatibility of the covered equipment with any software or equipment installed, introduced, or networked within the prior 30 days; or
 - 2) Insufficient size, capability, or capacity of the covered equipment;
 - 3) Exposure to adverse environmental conditions, including but not limited to change in temperature or humidity, unless such conditions result in an observable loss of functionality. Loss of warranty shall not be considered an observable loss of functionality.

Outdoor Property: Fixed or permanent structures including but not limited to:

- › Docks, wharves, piers, pilings, or bulkheads;
- › Dumpsters, concrete trash containers, or permanent recycling bins;
- › Electric utility power transmission and distribution lines, poles and related equipment owned by the member;
- › Exterior signs not located at a premises;
- › Fences and retaining walls;
- › Historical markers and flagpoles;
- › Hydrants, not associated with a sprinkler system;
- › Lighting towers;
- › Playground equipment, park shelters, pedestrian-only bridges, picnic tables, water fountains or coolers, benches, dugouts, bleachers, or scoreboards;
- › Storage sheds, garages, pavilions, or other similar buildings or structures not located at a premises; or
- › Traffic lights, streetlights, traffic signs, parking meters, or bus shelters.

Personal Property: Means all property used in your operations other than real property, including but, not limited to:

- › Furnishings and office equipment
- › Building contents;
- › Computer equipment;
- › Communication systems;

- Materials, supplies (including your inventory of vehicle parts and supplies) while held on your premises awaiting installation;
- Base stations and dispatching systems, provided the property is on your premises and also provided you own the property, or the property is in your custody or control, and you are responsible for it, even though it belongs to someone else;
- Value of your right to use improvements made as a tenant, if you have paid for alterations or additions to any building or structure that you do not own (improvements must be at a premises).

Pollution Conditions: The discharge, dispersal, release, seepage, migration, or escape of smoke, vapors, soot, fumes, acids, alkalis, toxic chemicals, liquids or gases, hazardous materials, waste materials (including medical, infectious and pathological wastes) or electromagnetic fields into or upon land or any structures thereon, the atmosphere, or any watercourse or body of water including groundwater.

Real Property: The items at a premises described in the Declarations.

This includes:

- Aboveground piping;
- Aboveground and belowground "penstock";
- Additions under construction;
- Air cascade units that are not designed to be used off "premises";
- All appurtenant buildings or structures other than playground equipment, park shelters, pedestrian-only bridges, picnic tables, water fountains or coolers, benches, dugouts, bleachers, or scoreboards;
- Alterations and repairs to the buildings or structures;
- Completed additions;
- Exterior signs, meaning neon, automatic, mechanical, electric or other signs either attached to the outside of a building or structure, or standing free in the open;
- Foundations;
- Materials, equipment, supplies and temporary structures you own or for which you are responsible, on the "premises" or in the open (including property inside "vehicles") within 1,000 feet of the "premises", used for making additions, alterations or repairs to buildings or structures at the "premises";
- Outdoor fixtures;
- Paved surfaces such as sidewalks, bike paths, walkways, patios or parking lots;
- Permanently installed fixtures, machinery, and equipment;
- "Personal property" used for the maintenance and service of buildings or structures, including tools, lawn care equipment, and free-standing appliances for refrigerating, ventilating, cooking, dishwashing and laundering;
- Submersible pumps, pump motors and engines; or
- Underground piping located on or within 100 feet of a "premises" described in the Declarations.

Remediation Expenses: Expenses incurred for or in connection with the investigation, monitoring, removal, disposal, treatment, or neutralization of pollution conditions to the extent required by: (1) federal, state or local laws, regulations or any subsequent amendments thereof enacted to address pollution conditions; and (2) a legally executed state voluntary program governing the cleanup of pollution conditions.

Tools and Equipment: All tools and equipment, together with attached devices, accessories and trailers, that are used in your operations. Tools and equipment include, but are not limited to, hand tools, mechanics tools, power tools, meter readers, generators, air compressors, welders, trash pumps, trenchers, saws, jackhammers, maintenance or diagnostic equipment including specialized audio-visual equipment and its associated laptop, as well as recreational equipment, such as outdoor portable seating, temporary stands, food service trailers not licensed for road use, or portable restrooms.

Tools and equipment also include mobile equipment such as, but not limited to, bulldozers, mobile equipment that travels on crawler treads, tractors, loaders, backhoes, excavators, graders, or road surfacing equipment, and equipment whether self-propelled or not, maintained primarily to provide mobility to permanently mounted cranes, shovels, loaders, diggers, and drills. Tools and equipment also include snowplows, salt spreaders, and other similar equipment when not attached to a vehicle.

As the annexation of Diamond Springs – EL Dorado Fire District nears completion, there are several final steps with the LAFCO Process. In order for LAFCO to complete and record the Certificate of Completion, one of the remaining documents is the Post-Commission Action Indemnification.

Indemnification is a standard LAFCO document / process for annexations such as ours. Upon agreeing to the indemnification agreement and paying the final LAFCO and State BOE fees, LAFCO will be able to record our Certificate of Completion.

This agreement needs approval from both the Diamond Springs – El Dorado Fire Protection District and EL Dorado County Fire Protection District Board of Directors.

Staff would recommend the Board of Directors approve the Post-Commission Action Indemnification regarding LAFCO project 2025-01.

POST-COMMISSION ACTION INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

This Post-Commission Action Indemnification Agreement (“Agreement”) is entered into this 5th day of March, 2026, by and between the El Dorado County Fire Protection District and the Diamond Springs-El Dorado Fire Protection District (hereinafter “Applicants”), and the El Dorado Local Agency Formation Commission (hereinafter “LAFCO”) (individually a party and together the “parties”).

WHEREAS, on January 28, 2026, LAFCO approved the change of organization or reorganization designated LAFCO Project No. 2025-01, for which Applicants applied, subject to certain conditions including an indemnification agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties enter into this Agreement to set forth their rights and obligations concerning such approving condition.

NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. **Indemnification:** Applicants agree to defend (by counsel reasonably satisfactory to LAFCO), indemnify, and hold harmless LAFCO, its officers, employees, and agents, from and against any claim, action, damages, liability, or proceeding brought against them or any of them, the purpose of which is to attack, set aside, void, condition, challenge, or annul the approval of LAFCO Project No. 2025-01, including any LAFCO action, or inaction, under the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) (including but not limited to certification of an environmental document(s), the use of any CEQA exemption, or a finding that an action is not considered a project). This indemnification obligation includes, but is not limited to, damages, costs, expenses, attorneys’ fees, and expert witness fees that may be asserted by any person or entity, including the Applicants, arising out of, related to, or in connection with the approval of LAFCO Project No. 2025-01, whether or not there is concurrent passive negligence on the part of the El Dorado Local Agency Formation Commission or its agents, officers, attorneys or employees.
2. **LAFCO Participation:** Nothing contained herein shall prohibit LAFCO from participating in the defense of any claim, action, or proceeding. In such event, the provisions of Section 1 shall apply.
3. **Settlement:** When representing LAFCO, the Applicants shall not enter into any stipulation or settlement modifying or affecting the interpretation or validity of any of the terms or conditions of the approval or requiring any further action by LAFCO or its staff, without the prior written consent of LAFCO. Any such stipulation, settlement, or agreement entered into without LAFCO’s prior written consent shall be deemed void.

Subject: American Tower Lease Extension

Staff was contacted by American Tower regarding the lease agreement for Station 44, Site 415354.

American Tower would like to extend the current lease at Station 44 with six (6) additional five (5) year renewals. This extension would also include an additional revenue of an additional \$150/month for each new “tenant” using the tower.

The current revenue from the tower lease is \$1,216.70/month, with a 15% increase every 5 years. The next increase is due in 2028. There is an option for a one-time payment of \$225,000.00 in lieu of monthly payments, through September 2063.

This item was discussed at the Diamond Springs – El Dorado Fire Protection District Board of Directors meeting on March 10, 2026. One option the DSP Board would like to explore is the potential of using the one-time funds to provide solar system(s) on Fire Station(s). Staff will be returning the item to the DSP Board during their April meeting for additional discussion and direction.

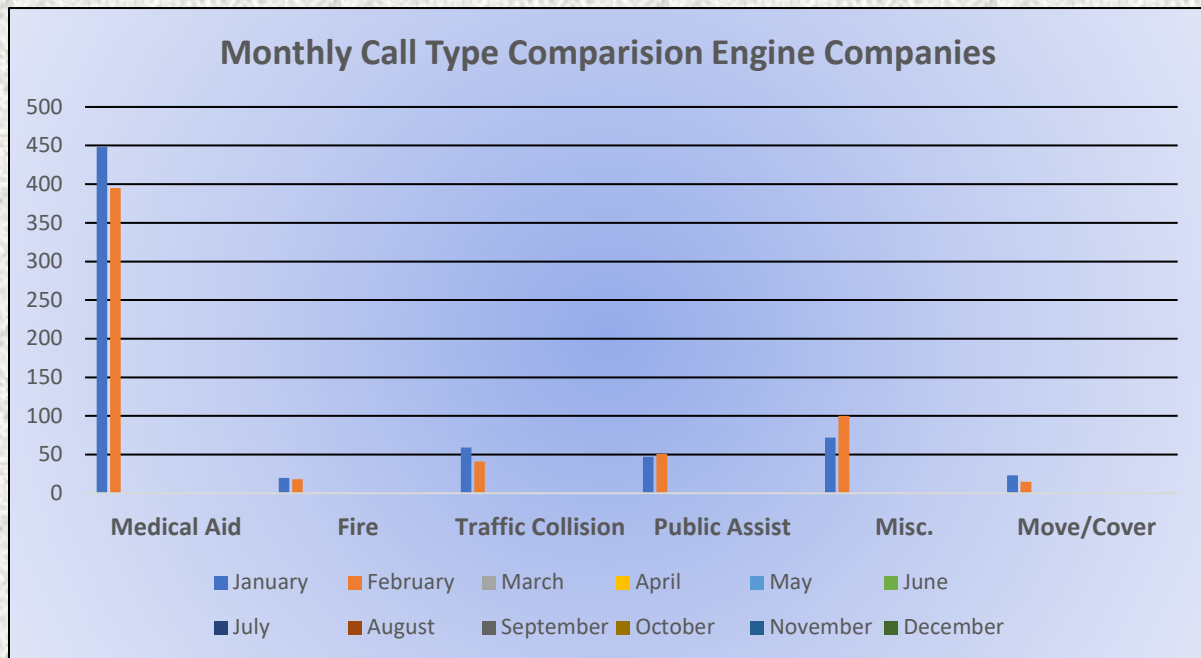
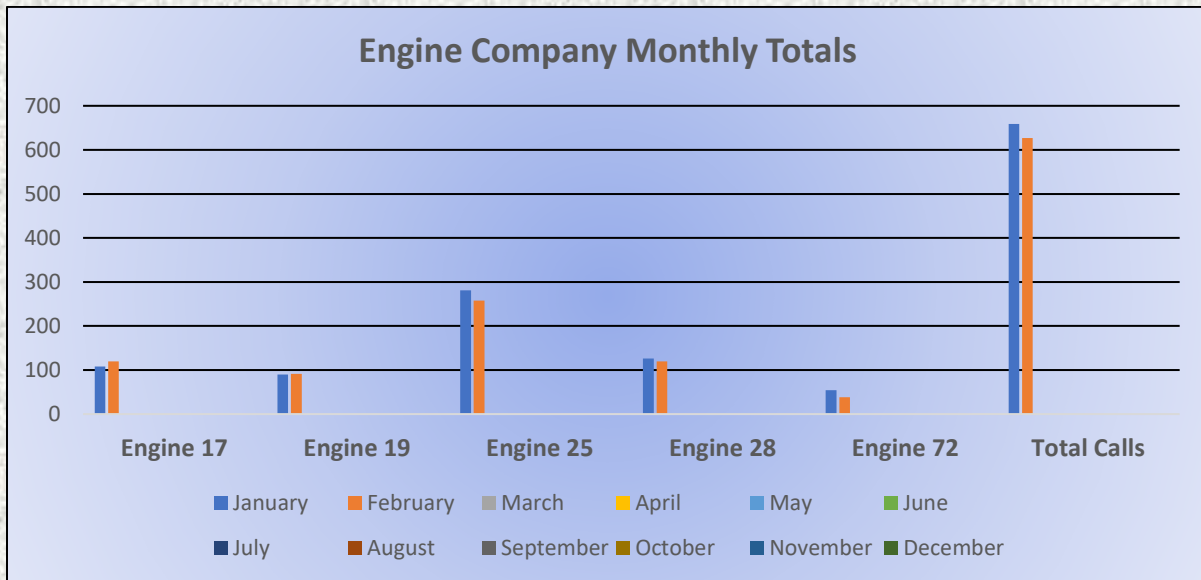

Monthly Run Statistics and Yearly Comparison February 2026 Engine Companies and Medic Units

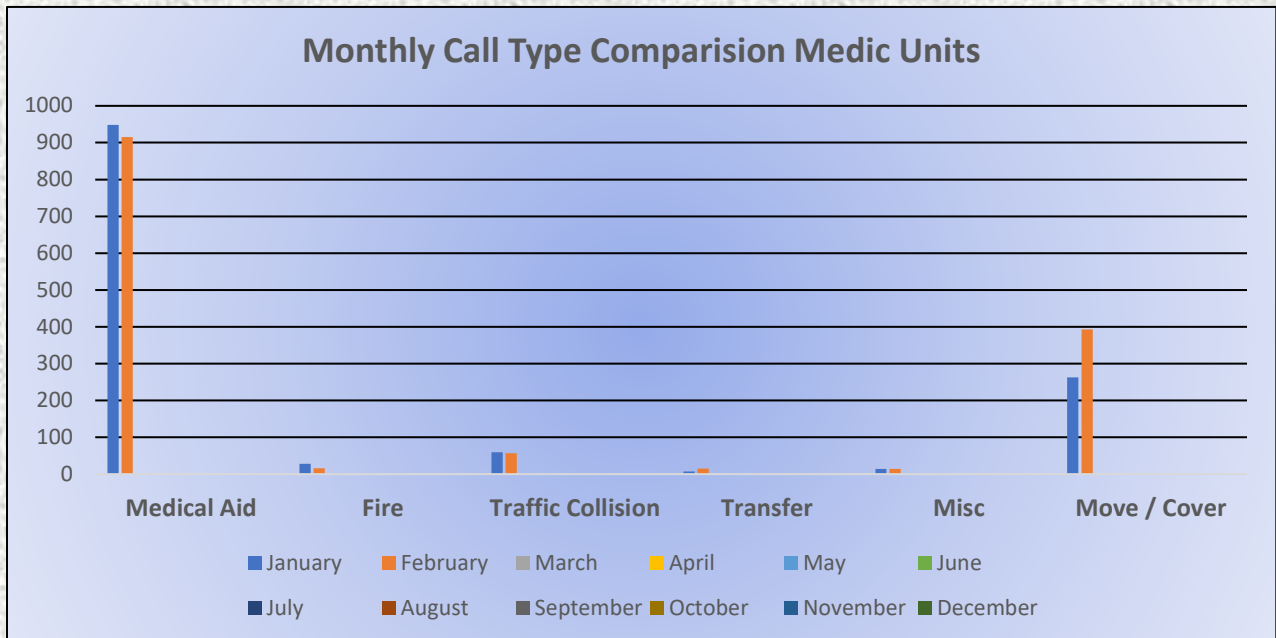
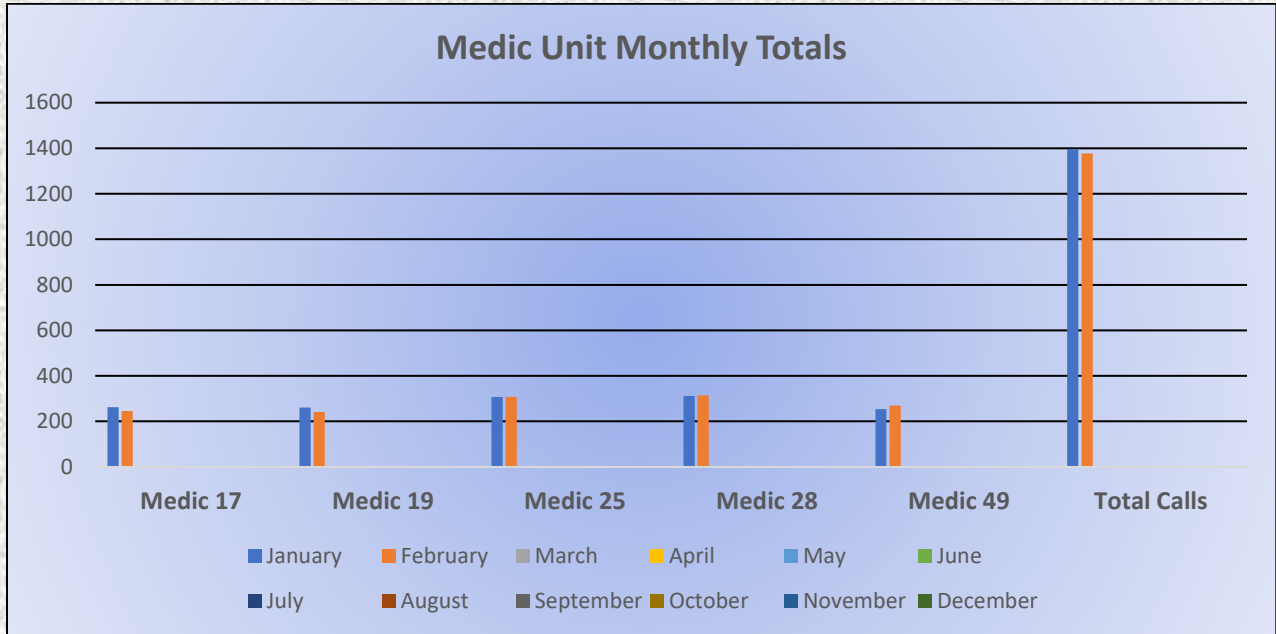

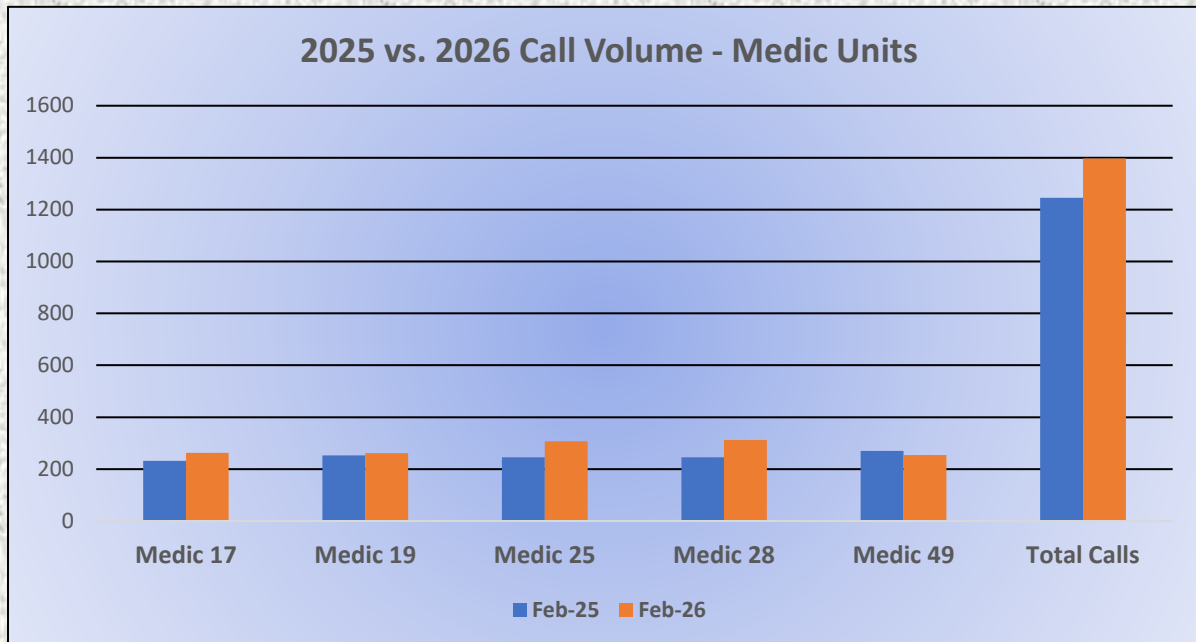

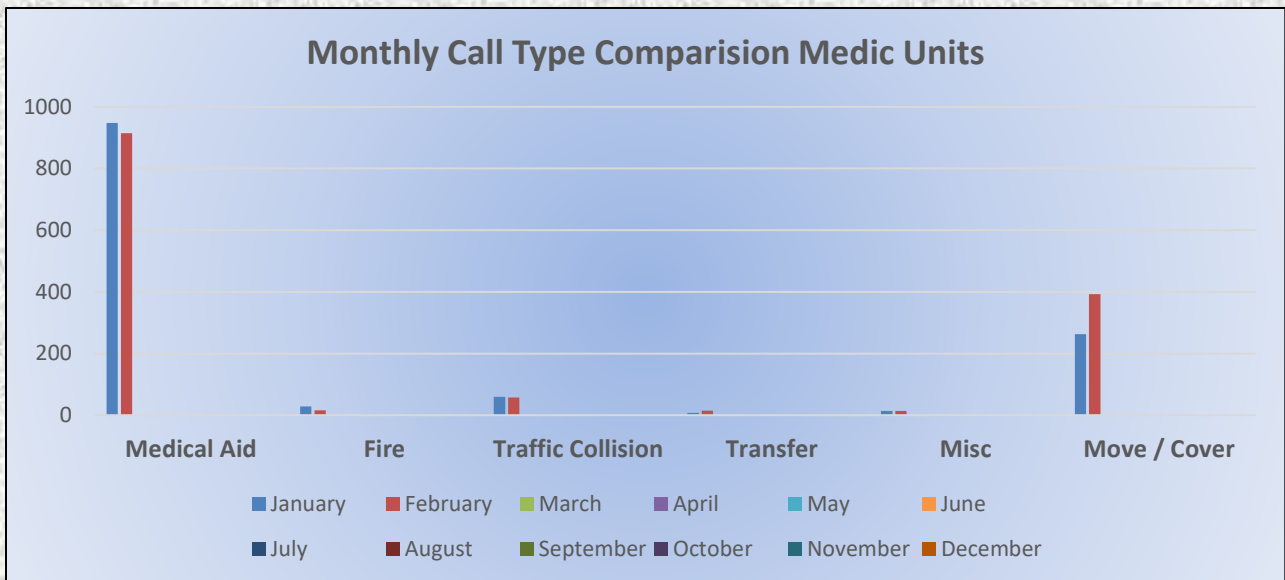
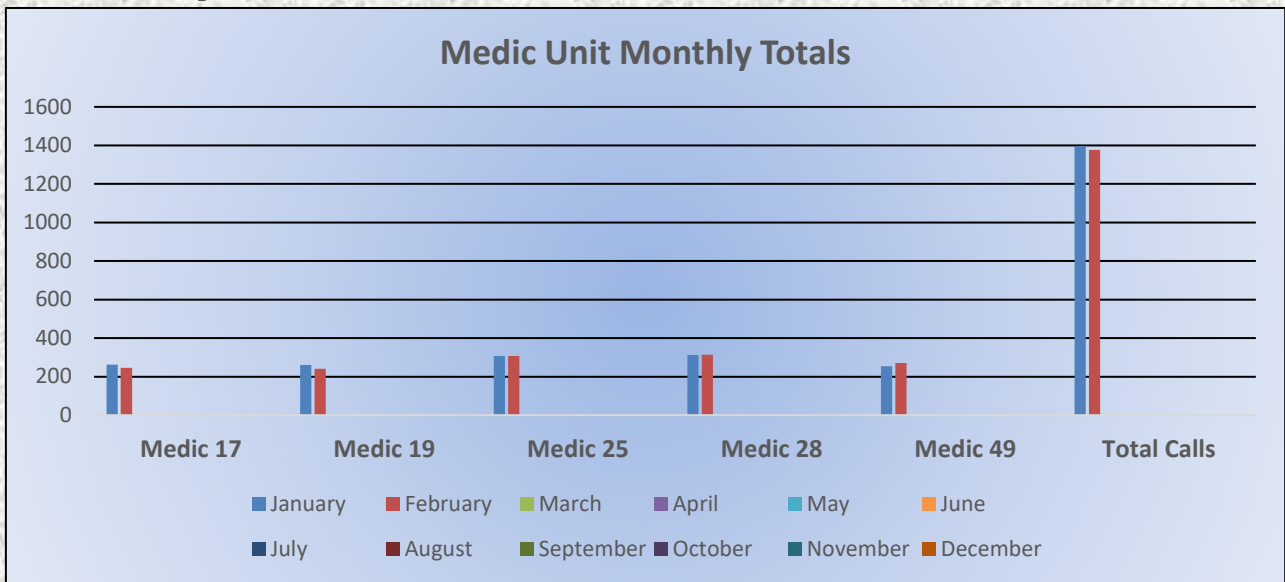

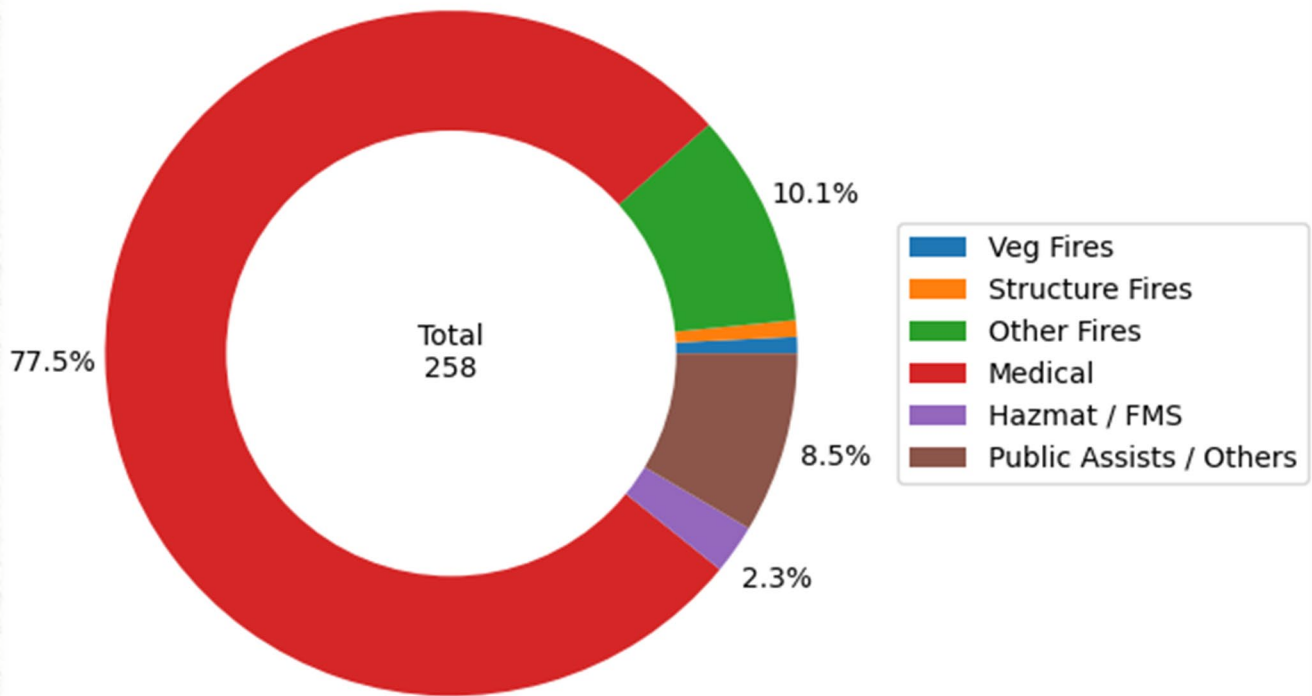


Engine 25 Call Volume Breakdown

Engine 25 Incident Distribution

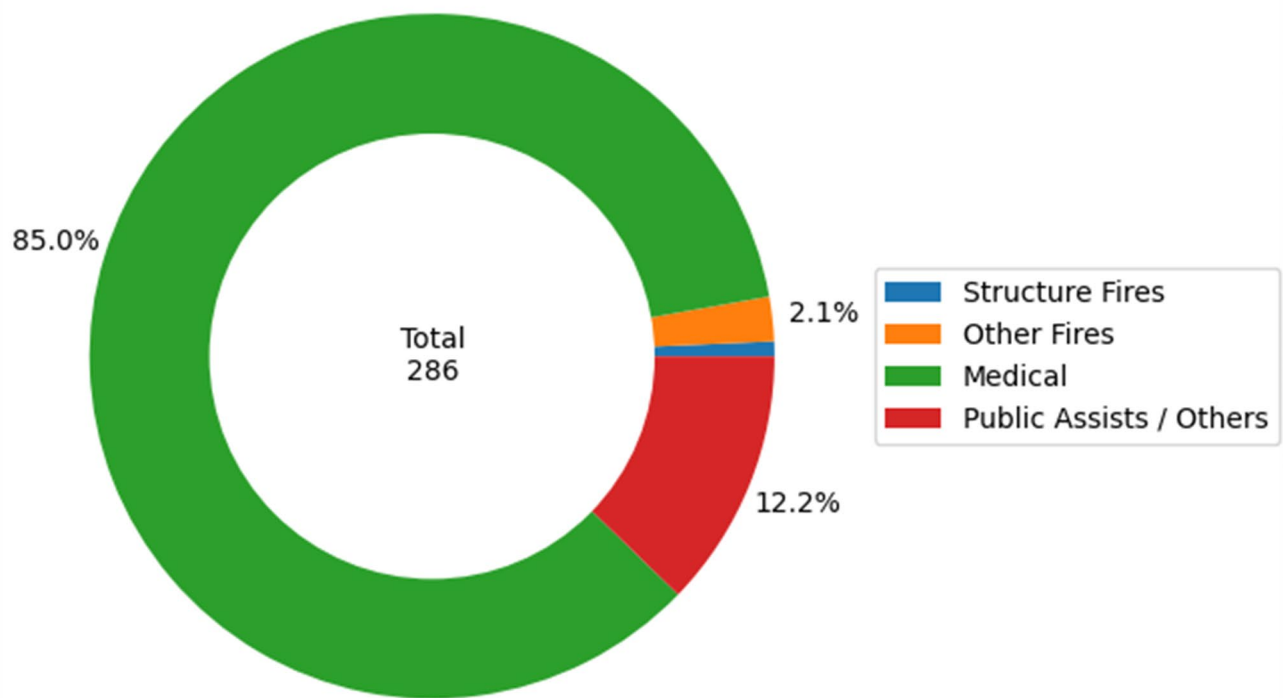




Medic 25 Call Volume Breakdown February 2026
