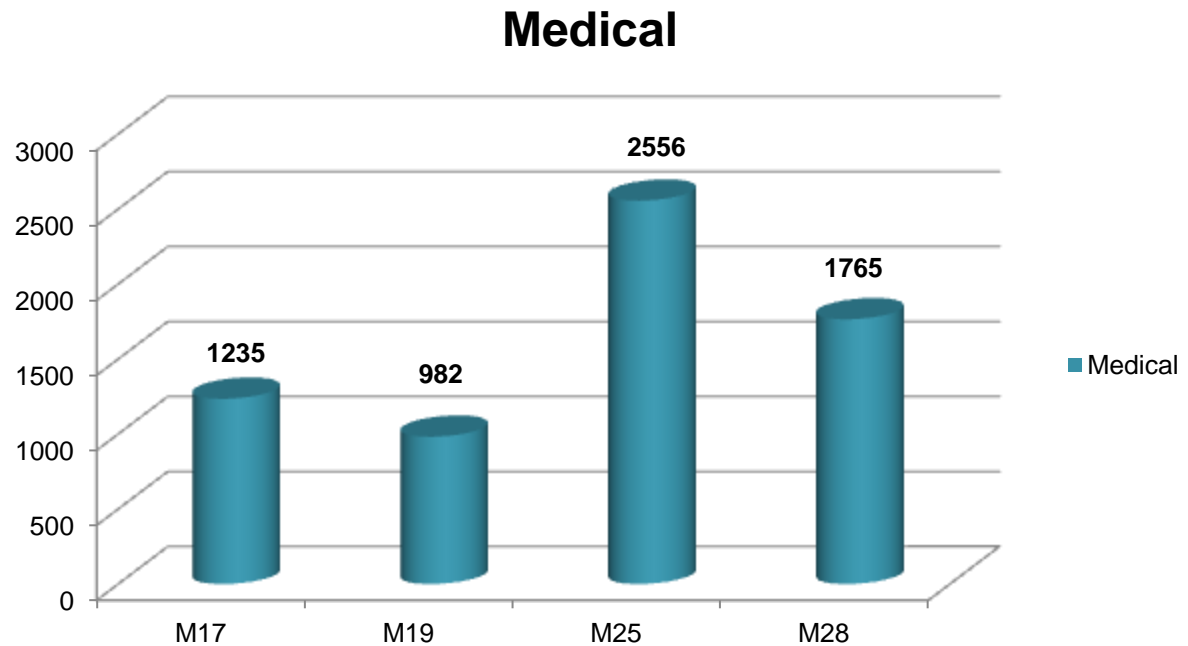

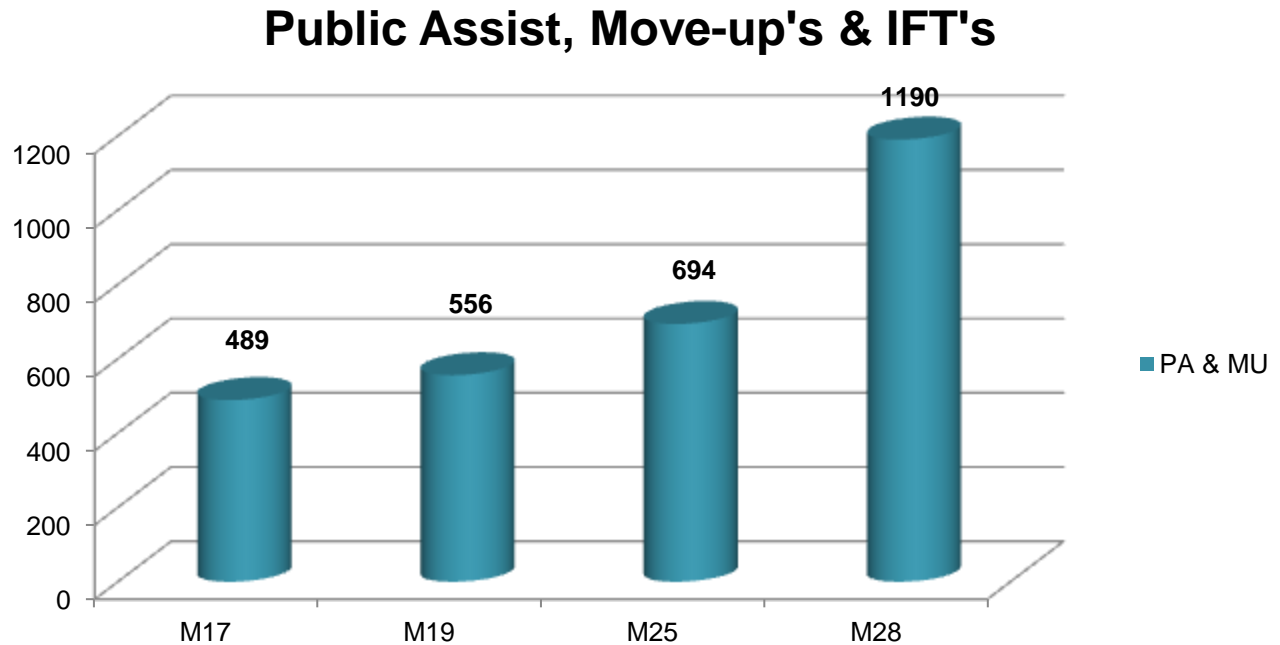

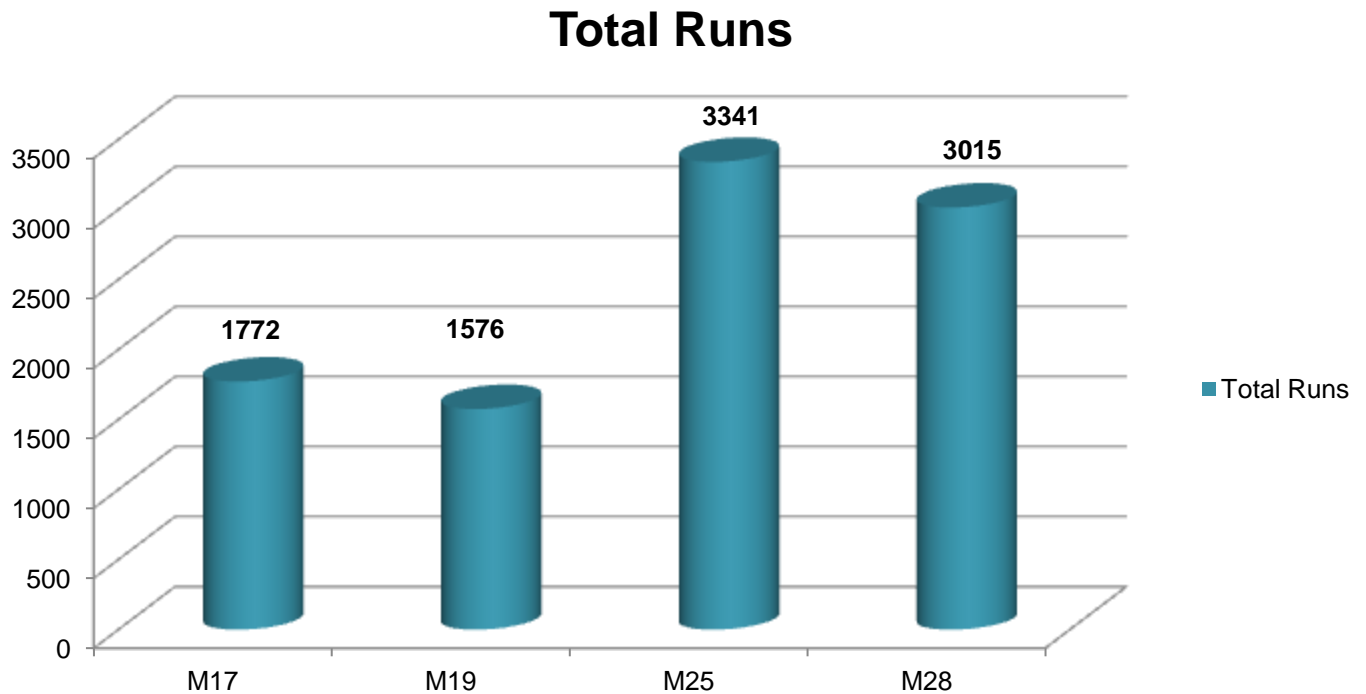
Medic Unit Responses: *Public Assist, IFT's & Move-ups*

Total Runs



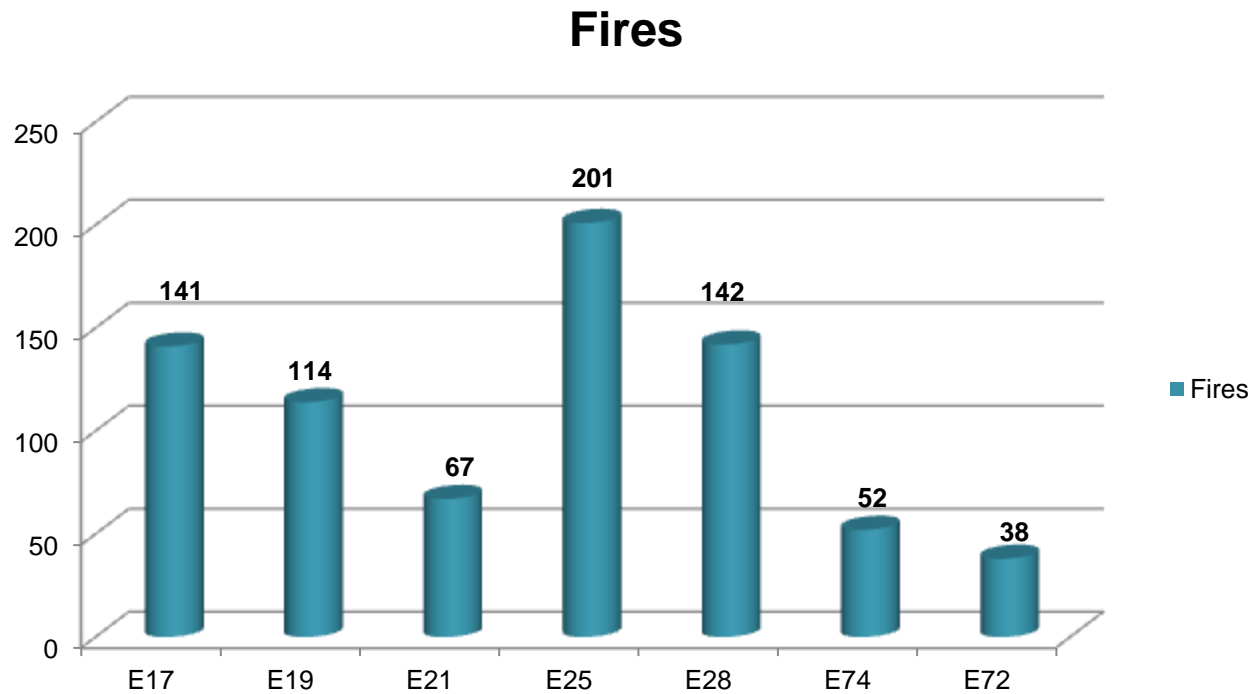

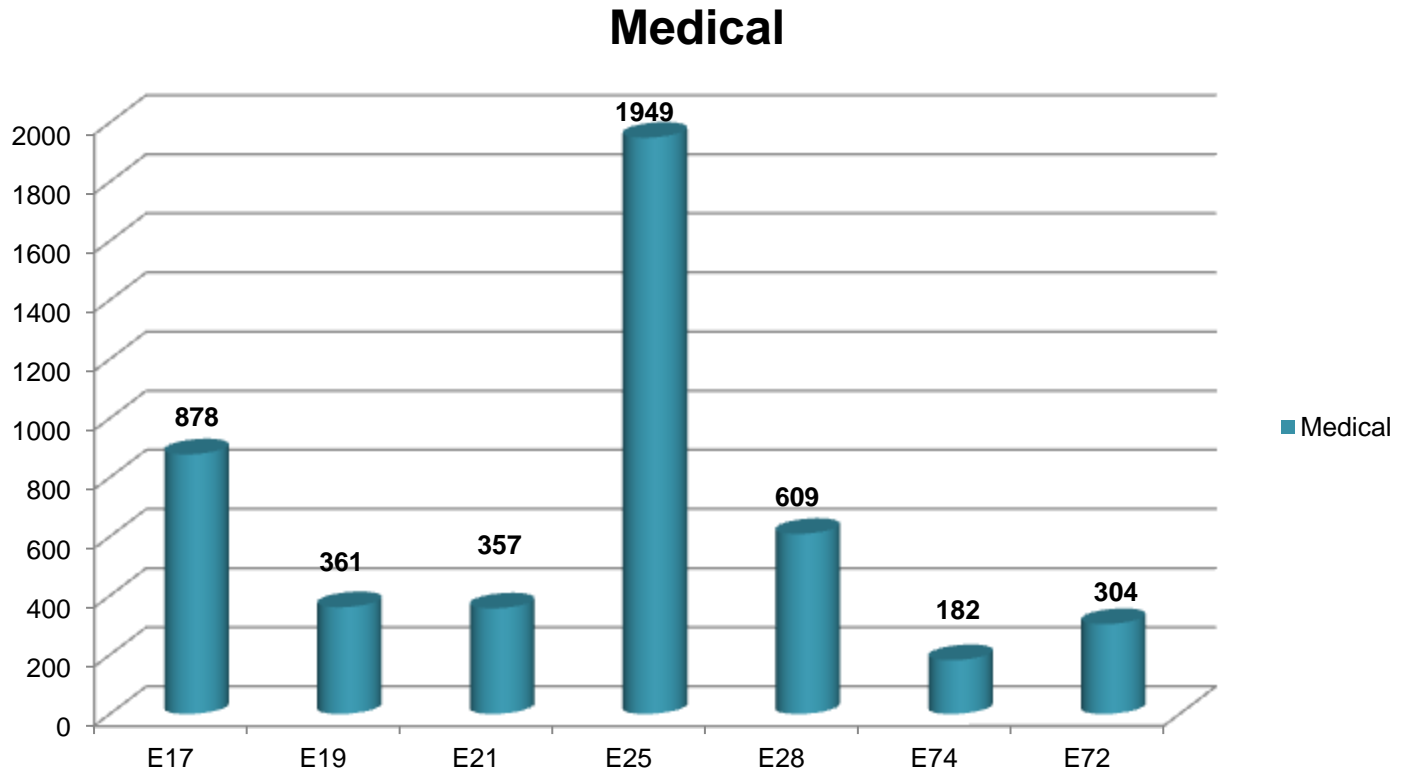

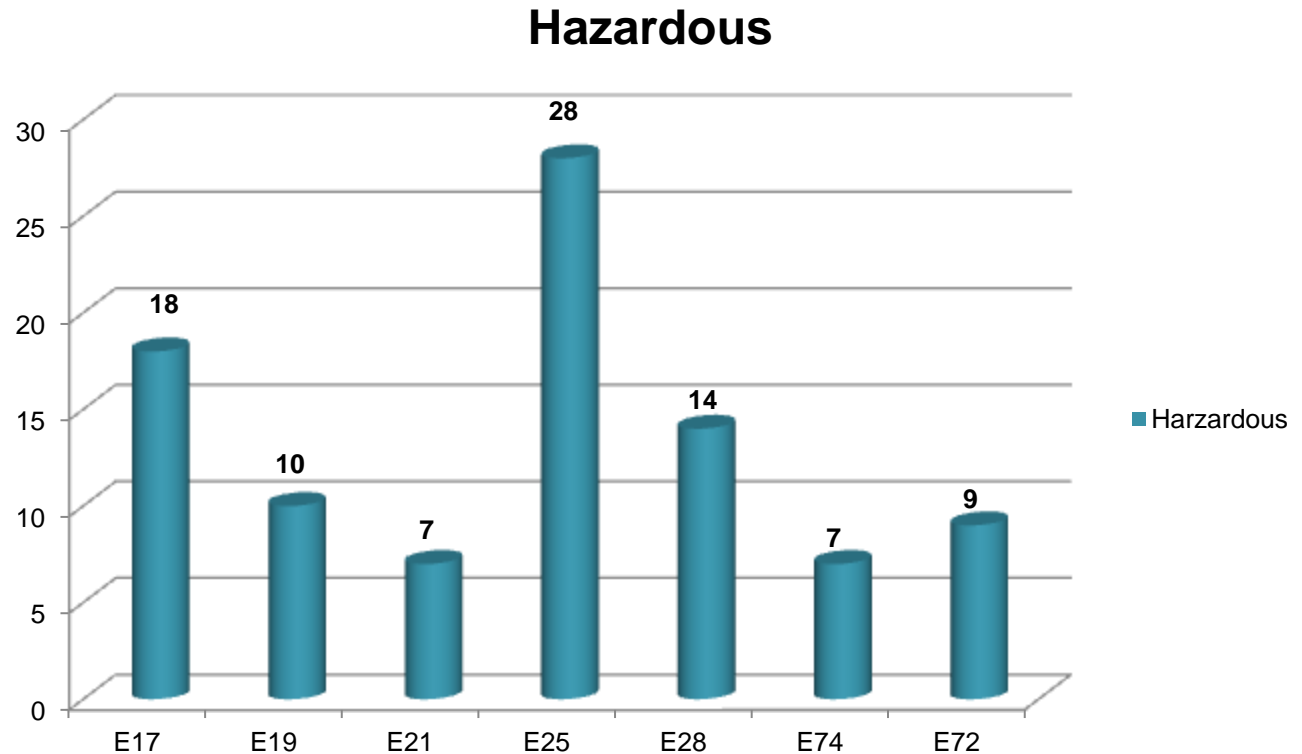

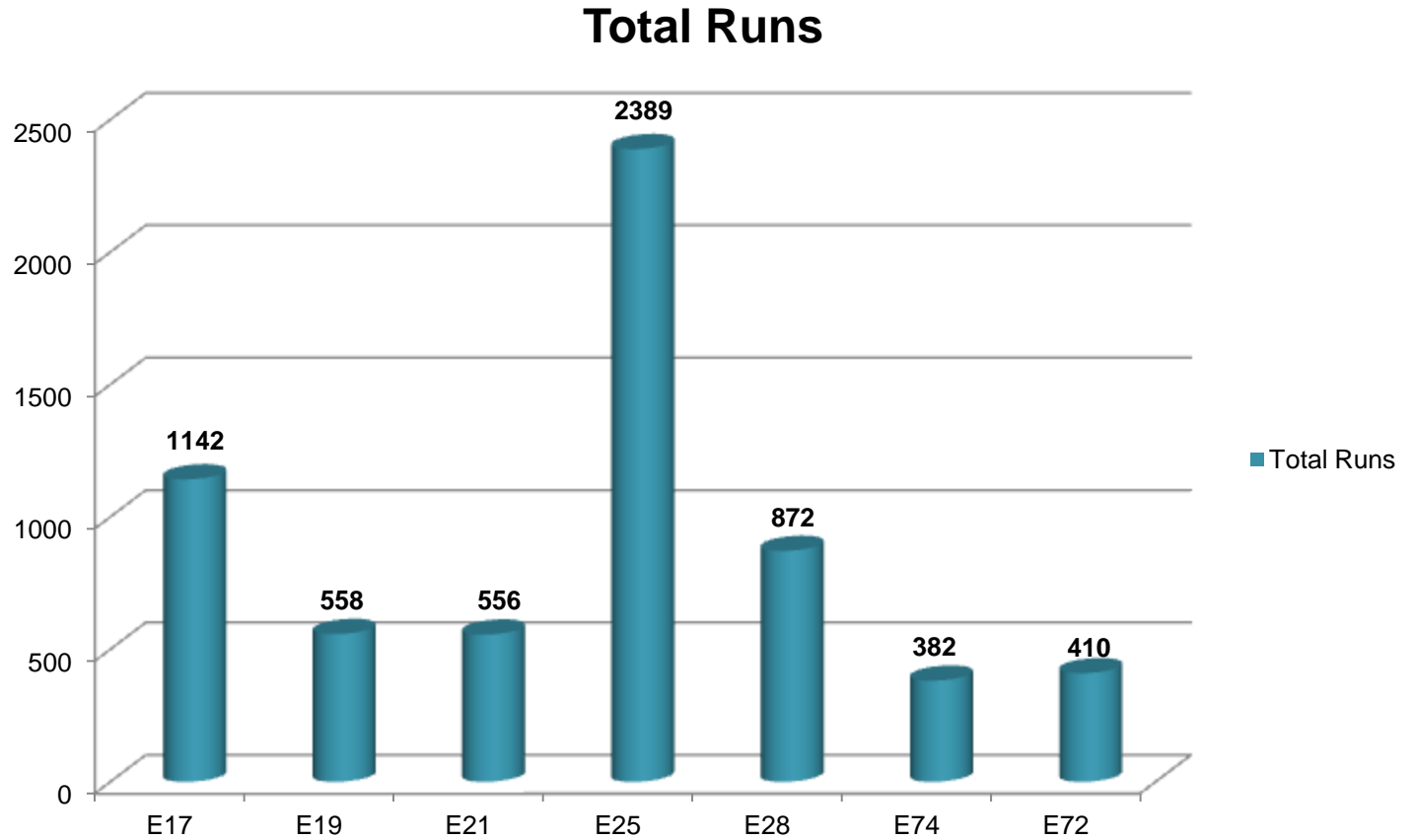

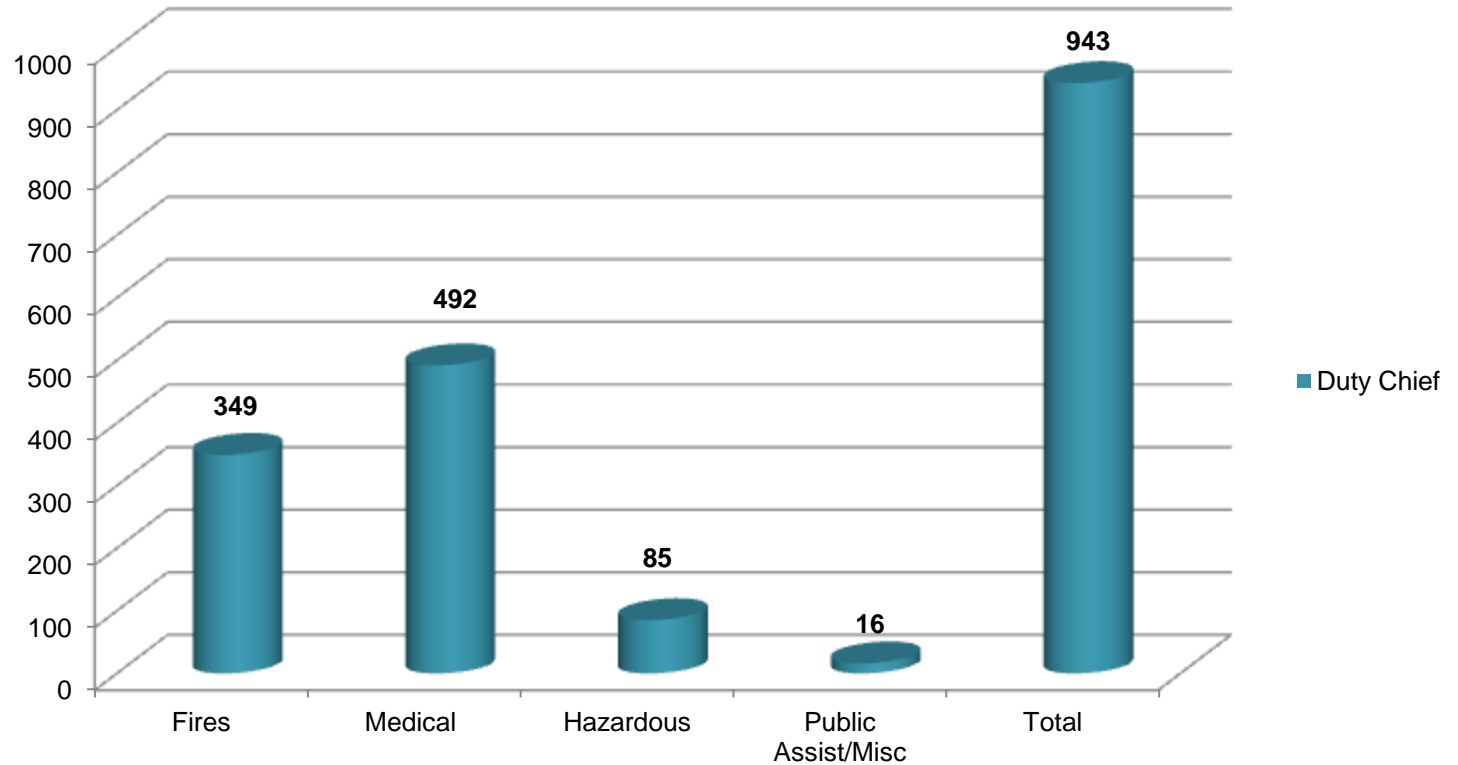

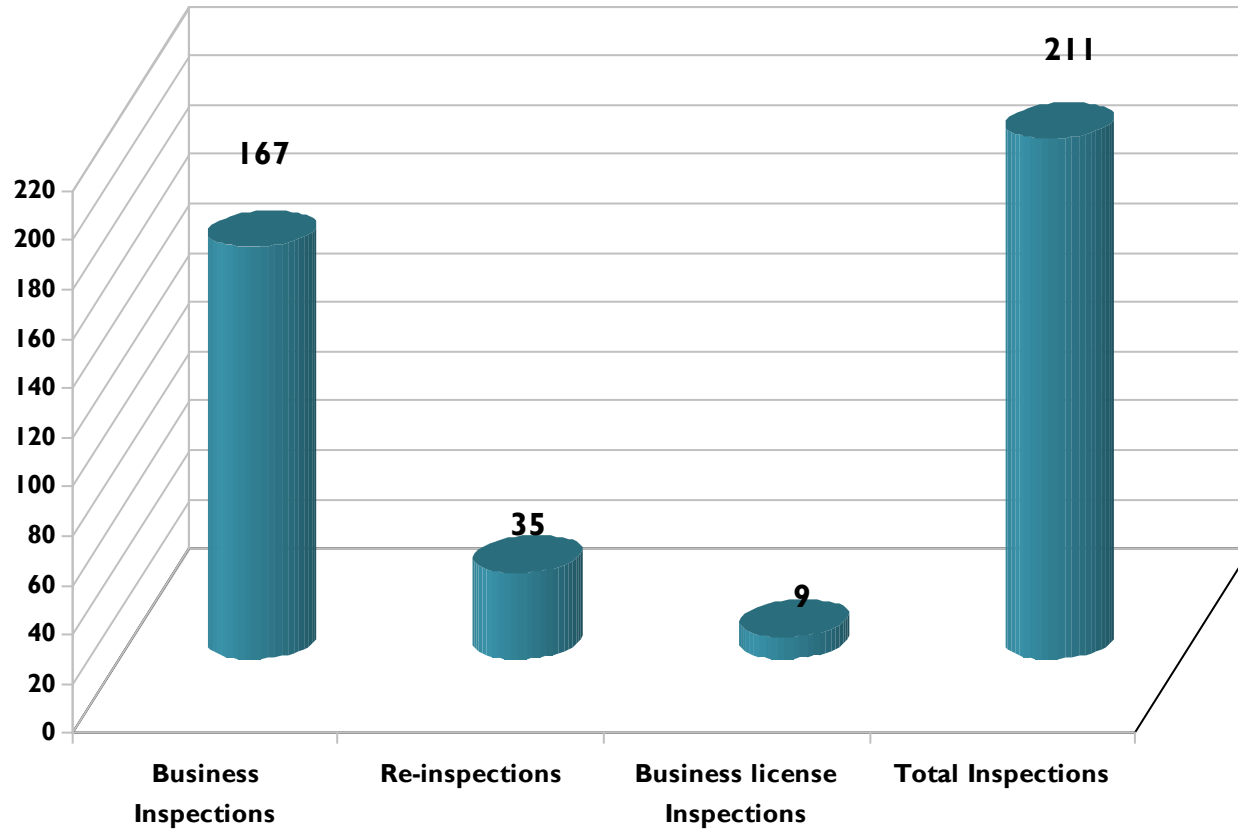

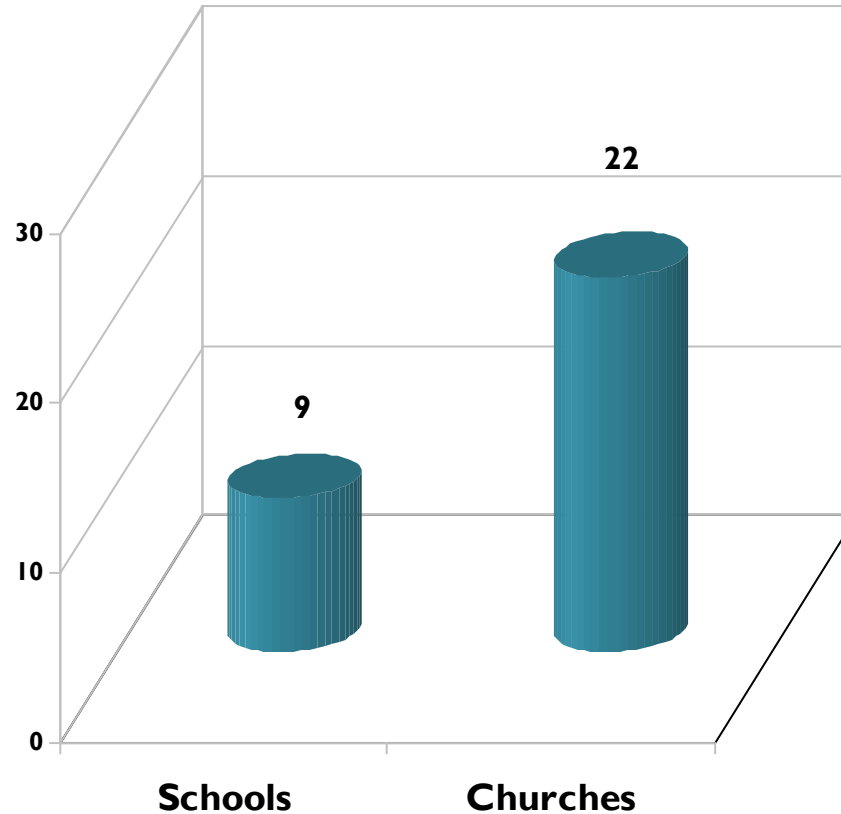

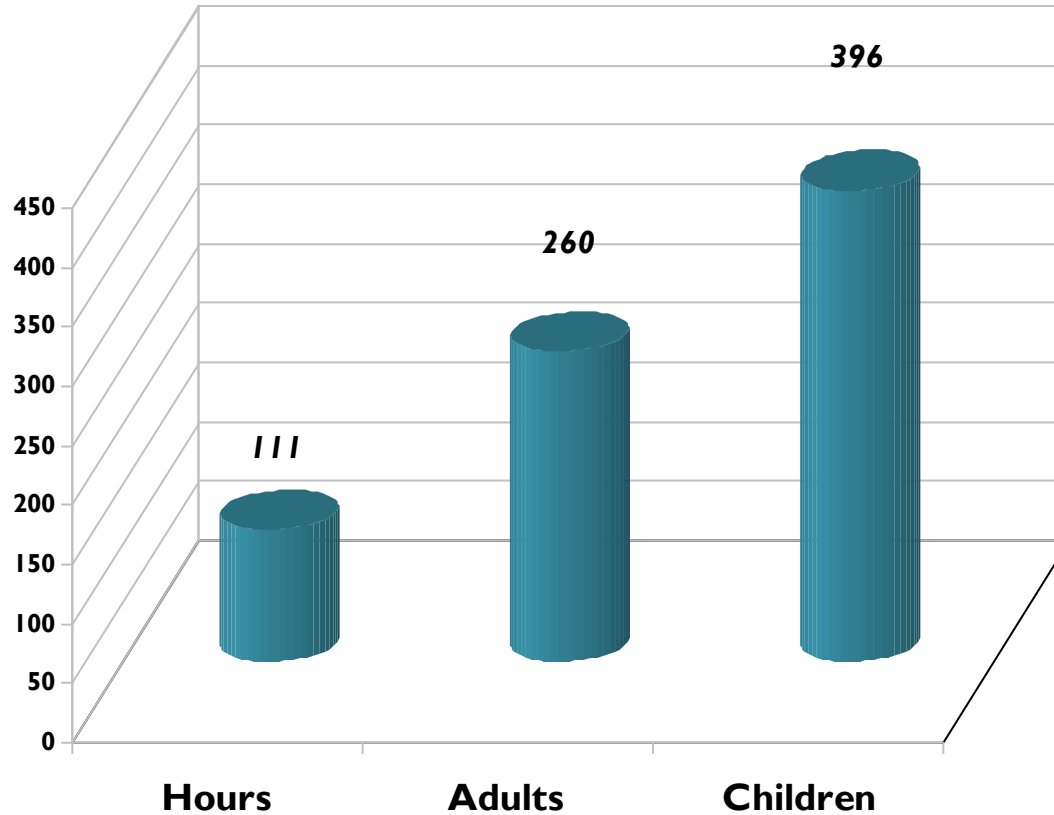
