- Continued participation in City Council meetings, City staff meetings, and various committees.
- Fire Prevention is actively collaborating with City staff on several larger projects.
- Preliminary discussions are underway regarding the upcoming National Night Out event.

### 🚒 District Information

- The Station 17 project is nearing completion. Crews have begun the move-in process and are expected to be back in service by the weekend.
- The loaned labor reporting testing phase is nearly complete; payroll software implementation will begin soon.
- The Image Trend RMS conversion is now complete. Thanks to Captain Lindberg, Engineer Chilcott, and Firefighter Thomas for their excellent work on this project.
- Chief Johnson and I presented to the LAFCO Commission on the challenges facing fire services in El Dorado County. The presentation sparked valuable discussion with the commission members.
- I attended multiple meetings regarding Cameron Park and the CSD Board, monitoring ongoing situations. El Dorado County Fire (ECF) has expressed support to both Cal Fire and the CSD as they navigate their challenges.
- Crews completed training with CHP for the High-Risk Team (HRT) program and are fully equipped and ready for response.
- Chief Stirling and I met with the Strawberry Fire Safe Council on May 20th at Station 15. The meeting was well attended with strong community engagement.
- The District recently completed testing for Division Chief candidates, with six successfully passing the process. Interviews are scheduled for June 22nd.
- County Fire staff will provide coverage for the County Fair again this year, staffing two personnel daily and utilizing our UTV.
- Medic 28 has transitioned to the PAO staffing model. There is currently one PAO vacancy, with a new PAO scheduled to start on June 19th.
- Two new Firefighter/EMTs will begin on June 19th. Engineer Ben Anderson will return to the District on June 29th. Additionally, one Firefighter/Paramedic is in pre-employment to backfill a recent vacancy.
- Station 21 duty side continues to experience septic system issues. Further investigation suggests the leach lines may be intact, and recent heavy winter conditions combined with Station 17 crews staffing the station may contribute to the issue. Chief Williams will monitor the system's status once Station 17 crews fully return.
