13. FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT:

- City of Placerville
 - We continue to participate in the City Council meetings, City Staff meetings and various other committee meetings.
 - Fire Prevention is working with City staff on several larger projects.
 - Preliminary discussions are taking place regarding the upcoming National Night Out.
- District information
 - The station 17 project is nearing completion, crews have begun the move in process, they should be back in service at Station 17 by the weekend.
 - The testing phase of the loaned labor reporting is about completed, we'll begin the implementation of the payroll software soon.
 - The Image Trend RMS conversion has been completed. Thank you to Captain Lindberg, Engineer Chilcott and Firefighter Thomas for all the work on this project.
 - Chief Johnson and I gave our presentation to the LAFCO Commission regarding the challenges facing the fire service in El Dorado County. There was a lot of good discussion between the commission.
 - I attended several meetings regarding Cameron Park and the CSD Board mtg. We are monitoring the situation in Cameron Park. I have expressed ECF's support to both Cal Fire and the CSD as they navigate their challenges.
 - Crews have completed their training with CHP for the HRT program. They are equipped and ready for response as needed.
 - Chief Stirling and I met with the Strawberry Fire Safe Council on May 20th at Station 15. The meeting was well attended with good interaction with the community.
 - The District recently completed our testing process for Division Chief, with 6 candidates successfully completing the process. Chiefs' interviews are scheduled

for June 22nd.

- County Fire staff will again be providing coverage for the County Fair this year, staffing 2 personnel daily from the fair and utilizing our UTV.
- Medic 28 has transitioned to the PAO staffing model. Currently there is one PAO vacancy with a new PAO coming online June 19th.
- The District also has 2 new FF/EMT's starting on the 19th, Engineer Ben Anderson will be returning to the District on June 29th. We also have 1 FF/P in the preemployment process to backfill a vacancy from a FF/P released from probation.
- Station 21 duty side has an issue with the septic system, in further research, the leach lines may be intact and not need replacement. The heavy winter, in conjunction with the 17 crews staffing the station may be contributing to the issue. Chief Williams will be monitoring the system and status once the 17 crews fully return to Station 17.
