Are you interested in working in a fast pace, all risk, wildland-urban fire district? El Dorado County Fire Protection District is looking for dedicated and passionate firefighters who are committed to helping the community. Located in the foothills, our unique geographical diversity provides a variety of different working environments from swift water to heavy timber. Every firefighter that wears our uniform posses a strong sense of our core values; Professionalism, Respect, Integrity, Dedication and Excellence.

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES:

Under supervision, Firefighters are to perform a full range of firefighting duties that include protecting life and property in the suppression of structural, wildland and other types of fires, perform emergency medical assistance and participate in other all risk emergency situations. Firefighters will be required to participate in daily training, fire inspections/prevention, drive ambulances and fire engines, and perform scheduled maintenance of stations, fire apparatus and related equipment. Firefighters work a 48/96 work cycle with an average workweek of 56 hours; however, some assignments may require 12 hours shifts with an average work week of 42 hours.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- 18 years of age
- High School diploma or equivalent
- Current CPR Certification
- Current and valid Driver's License
- Current California and/or National Registry EMT.
- Candidate Physical Ability Test (CPAT) Certification (Certification must have been completed after January 1, 2021)
- All newly hired employees shall not use any tobacco products on or off duty.
- The District may establish physical fitness requirements for new hires.



- Accredited Firefighter 1 Academy.

Newly hired firefighters shall obtain the following within one (1) year of hire date:

- Driver Operator 1A and 1B
- Possess and maintain California Class C Firefighter Exempt license with air brake & tank endorsements

The Driver Operator 1A and 1B shall be obtained on employee's own time and at sole expense of the employee.
